ABOUT THE CLEARINGHOUSE

One of the most successful public-private partnerships in America's highway industry isn't a road or a bridge, is a multi-media educational enterprise that connects thousands of transportation professionals and highway users each month to the information they need to make work zones safer.

The National Work Zone Safety Information Clearinghouse is the world's largest online library of free information on work zone safety topics. It has grown significantly since 1995 when Congress directed its creation. In 1997 after a competitive process, the American Road and Transportation Builders Association (ARTBA) was awarded the contract to launch the enterprise, and in 2000, the ARTBA-Transportation Development Foundation (ARTBA-TDF) assumed ownership and responsibility for its operations. Today, ARTBA-TDF leads the management of the Clearinghouse with its partners from the U.S. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Texas Transportation Institute (TTI).

Originally conceived as an online library with a comprehensive listing of information and materials related to work zone safety, the Clearinghouse annually provides over 200,000 contractors and agency professionals with answers to work zone safety questions, from the most basic to the most advanced.

Much of the Clearinghouse's information stems from its original concept—a robust online database of several thousand papers, publications, books, brochures, videos, and other types of record, as well as links to more than 1,200 expert contacts in the field.
